#### Pastor's Pause March 2023

**Philippians 2:1-8 (NRSV)** *Imitating Christ's Humility* 

2 If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy,<sup>2</sup> make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. <sup>4</sup>Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. 5 Let the same mind be in you that was<sup>[a]</sup> in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup> who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, <sup>7</sup> but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, <sup>8</sup>he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death-even death on a cross.

Sometimes I thought my kids disagreed just to cause me anxiety. I needed to stop asking them open-ended questions like, "What would you like to do tonight?" because they inevitably expressed opposing views and I was left holding the can of worms I opened. Any parent can relate to such tension filled moments and to the corresponding longing for a like-minded family.

Like any family, churches can be ripe environments for disagreements. In addition, there never seems to be the perfect time when trying to present something new. Some may say," too fast" others "too slow".

But also like any other family, there must be a spirit of like-mindedness for the church to function smoothly. Paul says it would make his joy complete for the Philippians to be like-minded. Jesus, as he faces his final hours on earth, prays for his followers, "I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, that all of them may be one" (John 17:20-21 NIV).

The Church is a large family with a diversity of gifts and plenty of big personalities. As we journey through Lent, let us remember that Jesus faced the cross with us on his mind, not only as individuals, but as a united body of believers, the Body of Christ. Can we make his joy complete this season by creating unity in his Body?!

**PRAYER:** Creator God, may I stand in solidarity today with all my brothers and sisters around the world who are suffering. May we be united in your love, and may I continue the necessary work to build your kingdom here on earth. Amen.

### January Finance Summary



FIRST UNITED 2023 Annual Budget: \$271,850 (\$22,654/month) January pledged and non-pledged contributions were excellent and February contributions look to be very good as well. General Fund is at 149% of monthly target and Capital at 101%. Thank you for your generosity.

We have \$87,607 in the checking account and Apportionments are paid in full. Finance feels that 2023 budget is attainable, but recommends that spending be closely watched and the budget altered mid-year if necessary. Additional fund-raising activities will be needed – please present your ideas to Finance committee or Ad Council members.




Information Session - Sunday, March 12th, from 10:45 – 11:15, in the Fellowship Hall
