Pastor's Pause, May, 2023

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called the children of God." - Matthew 5:9

Some days I struggle with that concept. Somedays, I want to lash out.

The Bible tells us that we are to love our enemies and to do good to those who even try to harm us. This is the type of radical forgiveness expected of Christians. Therefore, no matter what political position you have, or whatever religious belief you espouse to, believers in Jesus are to treat everyone the same.

Every human being is created in the image of God. Consequently, they deserve to be treated with dignity and respect. In fact, believers should regard others more important than even themselves. We are to serve our community and love others unconditionally.

RECONCILING COMMITTEE

We are learning that members of our church are unsure why we have to keep talking about being welcoming to the LGBTQA+ community. I thought I would share a few reasons.

- I. Membership in our church (and many mainline churches) is declining. We need to welcome younger members into our church. For many young people this topic is a deal breaker for where they go to church. It is actually a reason some of our young adults leave the church and don't come back.
- 2. The UMC welcomes everyone, but denies some areas of participation in the church to the LGBTQA+ community. This is the only group that is denied, thus the reason we need to talk about this community.
- 3. The other mainline protestant churches in Stillwater have a more accepting stance on the LGBTQA+ community. They have already become open and welcoming to the LGBTQA+ community. At FUMC, we are behind the other churches in this area.
- 4. In 2024 next year the UMC General Conference WILL be meeting AND voting on the topic of how we will stand regarding the LGBTQA+ community. Will it split the church? When that vote happens at General Conference, our church will have to decide what we want to do. The Reconciling Committee hopes we can help keep the church informed. Within our church there are many different thoughts on this topic. During the next few months, the Reconciling Committee plans to continue our one-on-one visits, so we can talk with more people in the congregation and learn about their views and thoughts. We will hold the book study and panel to the fall.

Pastor Jenny is new to our congregation, and she is hearing from those who have concerns about this conversation. I appreciated that we have a difference of opinions. I would just ask those members who feel strongly about becoming Reconciling also make a point to let Pastor Jenny know this, through a comment, call, note or email. One of the reasons Pastor Jenny was appointed here by the Bishop, was because in our church description and HCI report, we requested someone who is open to being with us as we learn more about becoming Reconciling. She needs to hear from both sides.

CARING MINISTRY TEAM

The Caring Ministries Team provides support to those in need in the form of meals, soup, grief support, greeting cards and flowers at Easter and Christmas. New last month is a program called Conversation Partners. This is designed to connect with those at home or a care facility that are isolated and in need of social interaction. Being a "conversation partner" means that you will be willing to visit or call one of the 13 folks on the list. URGENT Need for Tech Help with Sunday Services

The Tech Team has lost several members in the last couple of months and is now running with a minimum crew of 2 people. We typically have 3 people running the equipment each worship service. If one person is not able to assist with a worship service, we may not be able to send our worship service out to Facebook Live. The 35 to 40 people who tune into Facebook Live every week would not be able to view our worship service. Ideally, the Tech Team should be made up of 8 to 10 people. These 8 to 10 people will be trained on each of the 3 pieces of equipment used during a worship service. Once trained, they will be added to the rotation to cover 1 of the pieces of equipment on



Sunday morning or during one of our special services. Our goal is to have enough Tech Team people to cover every piece of equipment once or twice a month. We are looking for men, women, and teenagers to help fill out our tech team.
