PASTOR'S PAUSE MARCH 2025



What is Lent? The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word "lengten" which simply means "lengthen or spring" - when the days lengthen and new life springs forth.

It is a time in which we anticipate the victory of the light and life of Christ over the darkness of sin and death. It is, to borrow a phrase from C. S. Lewis, a season of a kind of "happiness and wonder that makes you serious."

It is my prayer that as you journey from Ash Wednesday to Easter, you would be reminded of the reality of our broken humanity, but as days grow brighter, you would experience with greater abundance the reality of God's redeeming grace.

And so, just as we carefully prepare for big events in our personal lives, perhaps a graduation or an anniversary, Lent invites us to make our hearts ready for remembering Jesus' death and resurrection first and foremost.

In as such, the Lenten scriptures that follow have been chosen to help us reflect during this special time of repentance and reflection. (*All scriptures are taken from the NIV translation)

- **Isaiah 58:6** Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen: to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke, to set the oppressed free and break every yoke?
- I Peter 5:6 Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that God may lift you up in due time.

Matthew 6:16-18 When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that it will not be obvious to others that you are fasting, but only to your Creator, who is unseen; and your God, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you.

• Romans 12:12 Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.

Daily meditation: Let this day, (especially Ash Wednesday), be a day for fewer words all day long. Let it be a day for some stillness, for paying quiet attention to mystery, to beauty, to the sacred. In the name of our Savior, Jesus the Christ, Amen.

1975 - 50 Years Ago, The worship committee reports that they re-designed the choir's participation in the worship service enabling choir members to join family and friends in the congregation after the anthem. 1990 - 35 Years Ago, The Last Supper Drama was presented for the second time with choirs and liturgical dance. A two octave set of chimes was purchased with memorial funds for the sum of \$798, to supplement the bells and to be used by the children's chime choir.
